About HBRC

HBRC is the Local Biological Records Centre for the County of Herefordshire.

A Biological Records Centre is defined as –

“a not-for-profit service run in partnership for the public benefit, which collects, collates manages and disseminates information of known quality relating to wildlife, wildlife sites and habitats of a defined geographical area”.

HBRC's main aim is to provide as wide access as is possible to both species and habitat records for the County of Herefordshire whilst at the same time assisting in the protection of those same species and habitats.

HBRC's database currently holds over 300,000 records.

These records are used to inform, educate and to provide real data upon which environmentalists, ecologists and planners, and other individuals and organisations can base decisions.

HBRC deals with all data for Herefordshire's wildlife, biodiversity, nature, habitats and wildlife sites.

We also aim to provide support for biological recording and for biological recorders within the County of Herefordshire.

The data held by **HBRC** is also used in Regional and National Projects helping to conserve biodiversity on a larger scale.

How to Make a Biological Record

Have you seen a bird in your garden, a badger on the road, have you got squirrels on your bird table? Do you ever wonder who to tell?

HBRC are always keen to hear from you about plants and animals that you have seen to help us build a picture of the wildlife in Herefordshire.

If you want to tell us about a plant or animal you have seen first you must make sure you have the right information

WHO – That's you!
Your name or the name of the person who saw the record and contact details. We need this so that if we have any questions about the record we can get in touch with you.

WHAT – What did you see?
You need to tell us what you saw and give us as much information as possible about what it was doing.

E.g. 'I saw a badger dead on the road' or 'There is a sparrowhawk nesting in the tree at the bottom of my garden' or 'Otter footprints in the mud by the river'.

If you aren't sure what you saw but you got a photograph of it please include this with your record. We can then send the photo to an expert who might be able to tell us what you saw, you never know it could be something that hasn't been recorded before!!

WHERE – Where you saw it
A six or more figure grid reference is best but don't worry if you don't know the grid reference. An address, postcode or a description of where you saw it e.g. '*outside the post office in Breinton*' helps us to work out the grid reference so the more information you can give us about where you saw it the better.

WHEN – The date when you saw it
Try to make this as detailed as possible and include the day, month and year

You then need to contact HBRC with the above information so that we can add the record to our database.

How to Get Involved

Anyone can be a recorder!

We are interested in records of ANY wildlife within the county. Why not start by sending in the information about what you see in your garden or on your favourite walk? You can probably identify more things than you realise!

Identification of some things can be tricky, some species are easily mistaken for others. If in doubt, make notes and ideally TAKE A PICTURE. There are many resources available to help you, check your local library or try online e.g. www.ispot.org.uk where you can upload your photos for others to view.

Herefordshire has a large number of active experienced recorders and naturalists who are often willing to help budding recorders develop their skills. Many of these belong to groups focussed on their particular interest. Why not try contacting those that interest you for more information:
