Your Right To Vote By Post

Applying for a postal vote could not be easier

1.	The law now allows anyone included on the Register of Electors to apply for a postal vote without the need to give any reason or to have the form countersigned.
2.	If you would simply prefer to vote by post instead of going to a polling station you can apply by using this form.
3.	Postal votes can be sent anywhere, either inside or outside the United Kingdom e.g. if you are going on Holiday. However, please take into account that postage sent to an address outside of the United Kingdom may take time to reach you and for you to then return it in order for your vote to be counted.
4.	If you move house you must inform the electoral registration officer immediately, or you may not receive your postal vote.
5.	Please note : There is a deadline for the receipt of postal vote applications if you are applying for a specific election.
