

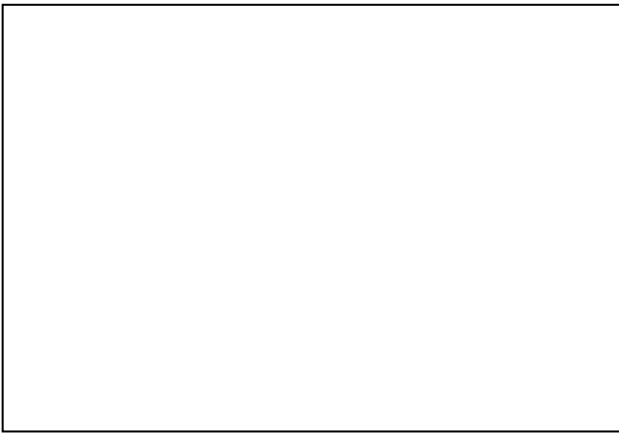

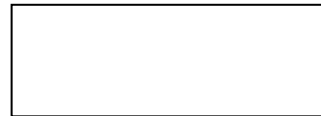

- There is a restriction on the persons who can apply under Schedule 3; see the relevant paragraph (from 15 to 21) in Schedule 4 to the Commons Registration (England) Regulations 2008.
- There is no fee for an application made on or before 30 September 2009, but a fee is payable for an application made after that date. Ask the registration authority for details of the fee.
