	AN commented that the GBBC needs to include detail of the defined benefit to the UK economy and to what extent it will be boosted by the creation of the University and the Engineering graduates.	
	Discussions were held in relation to the amount of funding we should request from Government. It was stressed that the figure reiterated at several meetings has always been £20m. If we ask for a significantly increased amount at this stage it could damage the relationship with the Government team. It was suggested that we could instead raise the idea of a performance bond in the future.	
	ACTION: DISCUSS THE OPTION OF REFERRING TO A POTENTIAL PERFORMANCE BOND WITH REGENERIS	ALL
	Investment from the Private Sector will be more forthcoming once they can see that government funding is in place. We also have a bid into the LEP Growth Fund for £10m. There are likely to be further opportunities to bid for similar, competitively allocated funding in future.	
	Current status of GBBC The draft GBBC was submitted to DfE on 06 September for comment by 13 September. The project team will amend and edit as required.

Executive summary: This has now been edited.

Strategic Case: The case is well developed but is being further refined as information is made available around displacement of students, teaching approach, employability and differentiation between other employer led engineering schools.

Evidence of blue chip employers who are supportive of working with NMiTE need to be included and DS stated that letters are due to be received from Qinetiq, JCB, etc., shortly. The employer commitment survey showed good results.

It was felt that it should be mentioned that over the last three years there has been an improvement in education attainment results in the county, previously we were behind the England average, but we now matched and sometimes exceeded the England averages. There could be some difficulty evidencing the increase in direct connection to the University proposals - however a line pointing out the correlation and highlighting the possibility of the university helping to drive improvements in future results could be included.

AN stated that more should be made of the Defence and Security sector, and the hopes that ex-military will make up some of the undergraduates. GS stated that the line that had been edited out when truncating about Marches key sectors would be reinstated.

Economic case: A four page truncated draft of the economic case was received from Regeneris / HTET on Friday 09 September. This was reviewed over the weekend. It is much better presented and supportive. They have been asked to boost the 'impact on local economy' argument.

Financial Case: DN & DS have produced two versions of the financial model; one optimal; and one worst case scenario. They are now pulling together a risk register to show how they mitigate against identified risks. Regeneris will circulate the latest draft of the narrative today (12/09)

Commercial Case / Management Case: there are gaps in both around timeline and risk but this is being progressed. The commercial timeline needs to come from HTET. Need to be clear about how we are mitigating the main risks e.g. financial: Warwick; academic: CEO and Warwick; student recruitment: development cohort, Warwick degree, and close working with potential employers, etc.

General comments: Students will be encouraged to attend by the assistance offered in relation to the accommodation costs, the fact they will be getting a University of Warwick Degree, plus the spread and calibre of companies that they will be working with.

DCLG are linked into the project and will be notified about who the GBBC has been submitted to, plus they and the Treasury will receive a copy.

The project has been highlighted historically and promoted to MP's, including George Osborne and Jo Johnson, who is thought to have a positive view of the project. The project team has been advised that contacting other ministers at present would be unlikely to succeed due to all of the recent changes within government.

Our main focus now needs to be getting support from the broader grouping; i.e. Marches LEP, local companies, etc.

GH & DH left the meeting.

AN commented that he was unsure what the strapline was meant to mean: *Engineering only, teaching only university*. What do we mean by teaching, needs to be defined.

ACTION: GS TO PICK UP WITH HC COMMUNICATIONS TEAM TO SEE IF THEY ARE ABLE TO COME UP WITH A BETTER STRAPLINE.
