Notice is hereby given that the County of Herefordshire District Council, known as Herefordshire Council, in exercise of its enabling powers under Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, has made the above named orders the effects of which will be: Garway To extend the existing 30 mph speed limit on the C1239 eastwards and westwards by introducing a new 30 mph speed limit between a point 693 metres west of the junction with the C1238 and a point 285 metres south east of the junction with the U71405, and also to reduce the current National Speed Limit to 30 mph on the U71405 from its junction with the C1239 for a distance of 141 metres northwards, on the U71412 from its junction with the C1239 for a distance of 14 metres southwards and on the U71413 from its junction with the C1239 for a distance of 128 metres northwards. Broad Oak To reduce the National Speed Limit on the B4521 between a point 285 metres east of its junction with the C1239 and a point 315 metres west of this junction and to reduce the National Speed Limit on the C1239 from its junction with the B4521 for a distance of 190 metres northwards and a distance of 230 metres southwards and to reduce the National Speed Limit on the U71407 from its junction with the B4521 for a distance of 50 metres northwards.

This Order will come into operation on 23 November 2018.

U71405, Garway

From its junction with the C1239 for a distance of 141 metres in the northerly direction.

U71412, Garway

From its junction with the C1239 for a distance of 14 metres in the southerly direction.

U71413, Garway

From its junction with the C1239 for a distance of 128 metres in the northerly direction.

- 4. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within Regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemption (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with Regulation 3(5) of those regulations.
- 5. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the following Order will be revoked in its entirety from the date mentioned in Article 1 hereto:






