30 mph speed limit: A4113, Leintwardine: (a) From a point 44 metres north of its junction with Dark Lane to a point 30 metres southwest of its junction with Hightree Lane. (b) From a point 30 metres southwest of its junction with Paytoe Lane for a distance of 198 metres in a southerly direction. **B4385, Leintwardine:** From its junction with the A4113 to a point 38 metres north of its junction with Hightree Lane.

40 mph speed limit: A4113, Leintwardine: From a point 30 metres southwest of its junction with Hightree Lane to a point 25 metres southwest of its junction with Whitton Lane. **U92209 Hightree Lane:** For its entire length from its junction with the A4113 to its junction with the B4385.

This Order will come into operation on 25th January 2019.

HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (A4113, B4385 AND U92209, LEINTWARDINE) (30 MPH AND 40 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2019

The County of Herefordshire District Council, known as Herefordshire Council in exercise of its powers under Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act of 1984 (referred to as "the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Paragraph 20 of Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:

- 1. The Order shall come into operation on the 25th January 2019 and may be cited as "Herefordshire Council (A4113, B4385 and U92209, Leintwardine) (30 mph and 40 mph Speed Limit) Order 2019".
- 2. No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour along the following lengths of road:

A4113, Leintwardine

From a point 44 metres north of its junction with the U92211 Dark Lane to a point 30 metres southwest of its junction with the U92209 Hightree Lane.

From a point 30 metres southwest of its junction with the U92206 Paytoe Lane for a distance of 198 metres in a southerly direction.

B4385, Leintwardine

From its junction with the A4113 to a point 38 metres north of its junction with the U92209 Hightree Lane.

3. No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour along the following lengths of road:

A4113, Leintwardine

From a point 30 metres southwest of its junction with the U92209 Hightree Lane to a point 25 metres southwest of its junction with the U92209 Whitton Lane.

U92209 Hightree Lane

For its entire adopted length from its junction with the A4113 to its junction with the B4385.

4. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within Regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemption (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with Regulation 3(5) of those regulations.

- 5. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the following Order will be revoked in its entirety from the date mentioned in Article1 hereto:
 - Herefordshire Council (A4113, B4385 and U92209, Leintwardine) (40 mph speed limit) Order 2014
- 6. References to any statutory provision herein shall include reference to any statutory modification substitution or re-enactment thereof.
