## (U71236 AND B4164, WHITCHURCH) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2019

Notice is hereby given that the County of Herefordshire District Council, known as Herefordshire Council, in exercise of its enabling powers has made the above named order under Sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to implement a prohibition of waiting at any time restriction at the following locations U71236 WHITCHURCH North west side from its junction with the C1250 for a distance of 68 metres in a south westerly direction. South east side from its junction with the C1250 for a distance of 25 metres in a south westerly direction. B4164 WHITCHURCH (Generally - the area to the south east of the A40) North east side kerb line (to the northeast of the roundabout) From a point 3 metres south east of the south eastern point of the splitter island located at the junction of the southwest bound carriageway of the A40 and the B4164 for a distance of 42 metres in a south easterly direction. South west side kerb line (to the northeast of the roundabout) from a point 8 metres south east of the south eastern point of the splitter island located at the junction of the southwest bound carriageway of the A40 and the B4164 for a distance of 8 metres in a south easterly direction. Western side kerb line (to the west of the roundabout) from a point 60 metres south east of the south eastern point of the splitter island located at the junction of the southwest bound carriageway of the A40 and the B4164 for a distance of 15 metres in a south easterly direction and from a point 136 metres north east of the junction of the B4164 and the C1251 for a distance of 14 metres in a north easterly direction Southern side kerb line (to the east of the roundabout) from a point 165 metres north east of the junction of the B4164 and the C1251 for a distance of 61 metres in a generally easterly direction.

#### **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

#### HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL

#### (U71236 AND B4164, WHITCHURCH) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 2019

The County of Herefordshire District Council ("the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections 1, 2, of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (referred to as "the Act"), and all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act, hereby makes the following Order:-

- 1. This Order shall come into operation on 144 day of Jen 2019 and may be cited as Herefordshire Council (U71236 and B4164, Whitchurch) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 2019.
- 2. (1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby assigned to them:-

"Disabled Permit Holders" means a person who has been issued with a valid Disabled Person Badge;

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 2000;

"Disabled Person's Vehicle" means a vehicle displaying a valid Disabled Persons Badge and Parking disc.

"Driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a Parking Place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the Parking Place.

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person appointed in accordance with the provisions of Section 76 Traffic Management Act 2004.

"Parking Disc" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (England) Regulations 2000.

- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying
  - (a) a Disabled Person's Badge in the relevant position, when:-
    - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited thereon so that the front of the badge is legible from the outside the vehicle; and
    - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous positon on the vehicle so that the front of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.

- (b) a Parking Disc in the relevant position, when:-
  - (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a dashboard or fascia panel, the disc is exhibited thereon so that the quarterhour period during which the period of waiting began is legible from outside the vehicle; and
  - (ii) in the case of a vehicle not so fitted, the disc is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the front of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.

### PROHIBITION OF WAITING AT ANY TIME

3. Save as provided in Articles 5 and 6 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer or of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the lengths of road as mentioned in Schedule 1 hereto and as shown for identification purposes only on the attached plan.

## POWER TO SUSPEND PROHIBITION OF WAITING

- 4. Nothing in Articles 3 of this Order:-
  - (a) shall restrict the power of the Council or the police for preventing obstruction of the streets, by order or otherwise on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination, or where the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed; or
  - (b) shall authorise the use of any part of the road so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by any person entitled to the use of thereof, or so as to be a nuisance.

#### EXEMPTIONS

- 6. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the sides of those lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1 of this Order for so long as may be necessary where:-
  - (a) the vehicle is waiting only for so long as is necessary to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
  - (b) goods to be loaded onto and/or unloaded from the vehicle;
  - (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the side of those lengths or road referred to, or the laying, erection, alternation or repair in or near the

said sides of those lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Telecommunications Act 1984;

- (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
- (e) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets.
- (f) the vehicle to be used for the purpose of removing furniture and effects from one office or dwelling house to another, or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the police, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they may impose are complied with;
- (g) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes.
- 6. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays in the relevant position a Disabled Person's Badge, and a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait in the said sides of those lengths of road referred to in Schedule 1 for a period not exceeding three hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than one hour from a previous period of waiting by same vehicle on the same sides of length of road on the same day).

#### MISCELLANEOUS

7. The restrictions, prohibitions and requirements imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption to the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provision of any other enactment.


## PROHIBITION OF WAITING AT ANY TIME

#### U71236 WHITCHURCH

- 1. North west side
  - (a) From its junction with the C1250 for a distance of 68 metres in a south westerly direction.
- 2. South east side
  - (a) From its junction with the C1250 for a distance of 25 metres in a south westerly direction.

### B4164 WHITCHURCH (Generally – the area to the south east of the A40)

- 1. North east side kerb line (to the northeast of the roundabout)
  - (a) From a point 3 metres south east of the south eastern point of the splitter island located at the junction of the southwest bound carriageway of the A40 and the B4164 for a distance of 42 metres in a south easterly direction.
- 2. South west side kerb line (to the northeast of the roundabout)
  - (a) From a point 8 metres south east of the south eastern point of the splitter island located at the junction of the southwest bound carriageway of the A40 and the B4164 for a distance of 8 metres in a south easterly direction.
- 3. Western side kerb line (to the west of the roundabout)
  - (b) From a point 60 metres south east of the south eastern point of the splitter island located at the junction of the southwest bound carriageway of the A40 and the B4164 for a distance of 15 metres in a south easterly direction.
  - (c) From a point 136 metres north east of the junction of the B4164 and the C1251 for a distance of 14 metres in a north easterly direction
- 4. Southern side kerb line (to the east of the roundabout)
  - (a) From a point 165 metres north east of the junction of the B4164 and the C1251 for a distance of 61 metres in a generally easterly direction.

- To clarify the waiting restrictions in the roads in line with current standards and formats, and to comply with current enforcement policy,

- For preserving or improving the amenity of the area through which the road runs.
