Construction begins on new Hereford Medical Centre



Construction work is underway on the new £9m Hereford Medical Centre on Station Approach. Patients are set to benefit from a modern and inviting healthcare environment, with five GP practices under one roof providing a healthcare hub for the community.

The new medical centre is the first of a number of exciting developments planned for this area of the city since the City Link Road made available land that was previously inaccessible.

These include new purpose-built student accommodation, with building work due to start this summer, supporting higher education in the county; and there are plans for a new transport hub adjacent to Hereford railway station making it easier for visitors and residents to connect between different forms of transport.

Borrow a bike this Summer

There's a new way to enjoy Hereford this summer. Herefordshire Council has partnered with Beryl to provide a new bike share service across the city.

Bikes will be parked in 'Beryl Bays' and you can hire a bike on the Beryl app, which lets you locate and unlock the bike using your smartphone. You'll also be able to leave bikes at other locations for an extra charge.

There are around 40 proposed destinations for bays across the city. Marc Willimont, Acting Assistant Director for Regulatory Environment and Waste, said: "This will give more people the opportunity to make short journeys in and across the city by bike, helping to reduce congestion and support increased activity levels."

A guide to your Councillors

Your councillors are responsible for making sure that the services that the council provides meet the needs of residents and those who work in Herefordshire. Councillors are directly elected to represent the people and therefore have to consider not just the interests of their ward, but those throughout the whole county. They do this by setting the overall policies and strategies for the council and by monitoring the way in which these are implemented. Councillors have a complex role and act in a number of capacities: as committee member, constituency representative and party activist.

The full Council of 53 members is responsible for agreeing the main policies and priorities for all services, including the council's budget.

The cabinet have responsibility for all decisions which the law, or the Council, does not require to be taken by others and agrees policies and actions to implement the budget and policies set by full Council.

Councillors who are Cabinet portfolio holders have more specialised roles in agreeing particular policies, representing the council while at the same time working with other agencies to tackle issues such as improving overall health and wellbeing, social care and safeguarding, education, housing, transport, and promoting economic growth within the Your councillor can:

- Be contacted to discuss your problem or ideas to improve the ward or
- Help you if you need • information or are dissatisfied with a council service
- Put forward proposals to improve the ward they represent
- Campaign on local issues •
- Represent your community within the

council and to other organisations

- Speak at planning and regulatory committee on matters affecting their ward
- Ask questions or put forward views on your behalf at public meetings of the council
- Present petitions on your behalf
- Get an issue debated at full Council by submitting a motion.

Protect yourself at Uni



All set for uni? Got your books, found somewhere to live, and even booked tickets for all the freshers' events? Don't forget one thing that could save your life-your free MMR and MenACWY vaccines.

The MenACWY vaccine is the best way to protect you from four kinds of meningococcal disease – the main cause of meningitis and septicaemia.

The Men A, C, W, and Y strains are serious and can kill. Those in their late teens – particularly new uni students – are at higher risk of meningococcal disease. You should get vaccinated at least two weeks before you start uni, so you're protected before you go.

The MMR vaccine protects from measles, mumps, and rubella. There have been recent measles outbreaks across the UK and in Europe, so it's really important to make sure you've had both MMR doses if you didn't get them as a child. You need two doses of the MMR vaccine to be fully protected.

University freshers under the age of 25 should have the free jab, along with anyone born on or after 1 September 1996 (if you've not already been vaccinated). If you can't get vaccinated before starting uni, get the vaccine as soon as you arrive.

Make an appointment with your GP now! It might just save your life.

Beat the Summer BBQ Bugs

Barbecues are an excellent way to relax and enjoy the summer. To keep food safe when organising a BBQ, remember the four C's of food hygiene.

Chilling

Some foods need to be kept in the fridge to help slow down the growth of bacteria and keep it fresh and safe for longer. Storing food properly helps stop harmful bacteria from growing. It is especially important to keep food properly chilled if you're eating outdoors in the warm sun.

Cleaning

Effective cleaning gets rid of bacteria on hands, equipment and surfaces, helping to stop harmful bacteria from spreading onto food.

Cooking

The biggest risk of food poisoning when barbecuing is from raw and undercooked meat. Cooking food at the right temperature and for the correct length of time will ensure that any harmful bacteria are killed.

Cross-contamination

Cross-contamination is most likely to happen when raw food touches or drips onto ready-to-eat food, utensils or surfaces.

New funding to help in the battle against litter

Herefordshire has benefitted from over £30,000 of additional funding to support community litter groups.

Funding was used to purchase additional clean-up equipment, training and signage for local community groups, and the council is in the process of distributing them based on the needs of local communities.

Existing community clean-up and litter picking groups work

collaboratively through the Herefordshire Stop the Drop network, and their ideas and suggestions were compiled to create a wish list of equipment, ensuring every community had a say in how the funding was invested.

Items purchased from the wish list include litter grabbers for adults and children, gloves and hi-vis jackets, litter carts and vacuums, signage and first aid training.
