ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (A465 STOKE LACY) (30 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2020

The County of Herefordshire District Council, known as Herefordshire Council in exercise of its powers under section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act of 1984 (referred to as "the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Paragraph 20 of Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:


- 1. The Order shall come into operation on the 6 day of 2020 and may be cited as "Herefordshire Council (A465 STOKE LACY) (30 MPH SPEED LIMIT) Order 2020".
- 2. For the purposes of section 84 of the said Act No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed in excess of 30mph on the following length of road;
 - A465 from a point 65 metres north-east of where the centre line of the A465 intersects the centre line of the C1116 in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 274 metres.
- 3. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within Regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemption (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with Regulation 3(5) of those regulations.
- 4. References to any statutory provision herein shall include reference to any statutory modification substitution or re-enactment thereof.

STATEMENT OF REASONS FOR PROPOSING

HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (A465 STOKE LACY) (30MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2020

The implementation of the proposed speed limits under section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 is necessary for the following reasons:

- To clarify the existing speed limit in the road in line with current standards and formats, and to comply with current enforcement policy,

- For preserving or improving the amenity of the area through which the road runs.
