

How to get to Herefordshire Council's museums in Hereford

The Train Station to the Old House

Follow the exit signs at the station and head across the car park towards Morrisons. Turn left out of the car park and walk towards the traffic lights. Cross the road you have just walked along so that Morrisons is immediately to your right and walk along Commercial Road. Continue along Commercial Road to the end where you will find more traffic lights. Cross over the road so that the Kerry Arms public house is on your left and Subway on your right. Walk along the pedestrianised area, past Waterstones on the right, and the Old House is the large black and white building which stands alone at the end of the market place square called High Town. The entrance is on the side furthest away from you.

If coming from the bus station

Come out of the bus station and turn left onto Commercial Road – heading towards the town centre. Follow directions above from the Kerry Arms onwards.

The Old House to Hereford Museum and Art Gallery

Continue walking away from the train station, towards Marks and Spencers. On the right you will pass All Saints church and immediately after this you should turn left into Broad St. Continue down the road and the Museum and Art Gallery is on the right hand side towards the end of the street.

Hereford Museum and Art Gallery to the Museum Resource and Learning Centre

Turn left out of the Museum and Art Gallery and walk up Broad St. towards All Saints Church. At the top of Broad St. turn left onto Eign Gate and walk along this road to the end. At the end of the street use the subway to go underneath the ring road and then continue in the same direction you were heading – down Eign Gate towards Whitecross Road. Take the first left into Friars St. and walk down this street. The Museum Resource and Learning Centre is on the right hand side at the bottom of the street after the bus depot. Walk down the drive and the public entrance is the blue door towards the rear of the building on your left.
