6.	PROPERTY Work is now underway on Blueschool House (BSH), and staff based at Franklin House are preparing to move into BSH once works are completed. HC officers have been advised about the need for planning applications for change of use for the building once it's vacated and are ready to progress.	
	Ian Higgs, Development Manager at Herefordshire council, is ready to talk to NMiTE about properties. • Franklin Barnes – teaching block • Essex Arms site – accommodation provision • EZ Shell store – teaching / research space	
	Specifications and plans need to be created for all of these buildings, plus surveys need to be completed. NMiTE need to procure some expertise in property. Require independent advice to ensure they are getting value for money.	
	HC advised that they will be procuring their joint venture property development partner in July. The partner will have architects, planners and builders available to deliver projects across the county. They will be appointed on a 10 year + 10 year contract so it's a long term contract.	
	It was queried if NMiTE may want to use this partner to deliver some or all of the works they require. DS queried if the venture partner has the skills to deliver, or a subcontractor that can. Do they have the ability for the buildings to be constructed elsewhere in a factory and then installed to site? GH confirmed that they do. DS felt that once they have plans in place they can take them to HC's partner for their consideration. It will depend on quotes received on who is eventually appointed.	
	A strategic advantage to having the same partner is that they have an ongoing relationship with HC and want to see things completed and to a good standard.	
	The University business plan shows NMiTE building and operating the teaching units and third parties delivering the residential space to the university specification.	
	A firmer steer is required on the initial cohort requirements of 40-60 students. If additional commitment is seen for the accommodation block for a larger number of students then potential partners may commit. DS advised that if HC and Hereford Art College work together to deliver the Station Approach site then NMiTE may want to house the initial cohort there.	
	The importance of an understanding of how the city will develop was highlighted. Potential students are going to want to know what happens in Hereford? What's the nightlife like? Are their Pubs/clubs/restaurants? What can they do on a weekend when friends/family visit? Is their suitable accommodation for friends/family when they visit? Need to look at how to develop facilities to support this. It is hoped that the Hereford BID group will respond accordingly once they are convinced that the University is happening.	
	Discussions have been held with the Herefordshire Association of Sport Clubs and they have said that students can use existing facilities; likewise for music, drama, etc.	
	Hot Desk at Plough Lane HC extended an offer for Janusz to spend time at plough lane if required with the use of a hot desk. GH advised that they need to know a date to set him up with a pass.	
7.	Appointment of Interim Programme Officer Director Three candidates were interviewed for the post. DN is working on a schedule of deliverables to be fed back to Hoople and then the successful applicant will be appointed on a four to six month contract. Their final deliverable will be to find their permanent replacement. The successful applicant was Pramod Philip.

He will help with the procurement of an estates manager who will have the professional skills to discuss with development partners, etc. RE has been helpful in assisting in this area, and it has also been agreed that Joanne Parkes-Newton, Interim Procurement Manager at HC, will work with the team for a few days each week.	
	NMiTE hope to fund this post via the HC loan for the first three months, until government finance is secured.	
	Marketing Development Janusz would like Eddy Evans to start with the team asap. He is based in Toronto at present, and would join us on a one year leave of absence from his current post.	
8.	REVISION OF JUPB TERMS OF REFERENCE - David Sheppard It was agreed that there is value in maintaining this group as it has worked well together. It has led to better coordination, good commissioning and project management, with task dissemination working to the benefit of this project and links with other activity. We have shared mutual responsibility for the deliverables in the project.	
	It was agreed that the group name should be changed from Joint University Project Board (JUPB) to Joint University Delivery Board (JUDB) . DS has revised the terms of the agreement to reflect this and stripped out any references to the GBBC, and instead focused on the delivery of the project.

	GH advised that if any loan funds are required the governance of the loan will need to be looked at, because at present it states that the money is repayable at the announcement of government money. Will need to look into the timing of the payment.

	Shropshire Council is the managing body for any funds awarded via the LEP for the Growth Fund Bid. It was felt that NMiTE need to have a discussion with both Shropshire Council and LEP to discuss the accountable body for the project

	Council reps had met with Peter Jones, Hereford Times Regional Editor, who has advised they are keen to run a lengthy stream of articles about Economic Development within the county which will be timed to coincide with the launch event. The team also intend to have a pull out section about the strategy in the Financial Times, etc.
