3.	HEREFORD – PREPARING TO BECOME A UNIVERSITY SMART CITY

	Urban design & planning consultants from AECOM, one of the world's leading urban design specialists				
	AECOM have been commissioned by the University team to undertake work for a month looking at a number of options. They will present a final report on 01 August. CT has previously worked with JR on a sporting development in Singapore, and feels he is the ideal person for the job as he has the knowledge and the experience to bring it all together. Everyone present has a shared commitment to make Hereford a great university city and getting the sites correct at the start is imperative for this success.				
	Detailed discussions took place regarding locations, requirements, infrastructure, academic programme, transport initiatives, etc. It was agreed that officers from AECOM will meet with HC officer's w/c 17 July.

4.	WORK STREAMS COORDINATION / PROGRAMME MANAGEMENT				
	- David Sheppard				
	There is now an individual in place working full time on building programme management. They need to look at how to create a business capital fund to help with the development of businesses.				
	A number of the works stream / tasks will be joint between HC & NMiTE. They need to identify individuals who will be tasked to undertake specific tasks.				





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5.	NMITE PRIORITIES UPDATE – Janusz Kozinski Understanding where they will be located is very important, as this will affect the delivery of some of the programme.	
	A curriculum workshop is planned with Warwick on 19 July. They should be able to finalise a substantial part of the curriculum at that time.	
	On 02 & 03 August a workshop will be held in relation to branding, where they will formally develop the mission and vision statements. They will be looking to advance the selection of the name and test it out on a variety of groups, young people, parents, etc.	
	JK has received a number of invitations from High Schools within the county to deliver a talk about the university to their students.	
6.	PROPERTY - David Sheppard Conversations and work continues in relation to a number of sites.	
7.	FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENTS WITH DFE AND LEP - David Sheppard  NMiTE received an additional six questions from DfE on 06 July, in relation to building and accommodation. RG is working to provide the detail needed. There has been a misunderstanding by DfE staff of the HC commitment.	
	NMiTE are due to meet with DfE on 12 July to determine the mechanics of getting money from Westminster to Hereford. There needs to be an educational middle man, and Herefordshire & Ludlow college have agreed to administer the money.	
	DfE are committed to delivering the university, but need milestones in place in relation to the bricks and mortar commitment. The GBBC refers to delivering the teaching space and the curriculum. At present student accommodation is not a milestone but it could be added in the future.	
	The announcement from DfE is due to be in the public domain before parliament goes into recess (20 July 2017).	
8.	LOAN AGREEMENT / FUNDING MONITORING – Richard Gabb  The loan decision has been signed by the Leader, and NMiTE are due to sign it following this meeting. The Loan agreement comes into place 11 July 2017.	
9.	REVISED JUDB TERMS OF REFERENCE – Geoff Hughes  This is included in the appendix with the decision that will come into force from 11 July. Both parties need to sign them at some point.	
	The Programme and projects will be the core agenda for this group, who will have oversight of the overall programme and be able to add value by unblocking should there be any issues.	
10.	NEXT STEPS - AII Actions listed above.	
11.	ANY OTHER BUSINESS - AII <u>Ebikes</u> TK has looked into the cost of ebikes and has found there are no margins for decent discounts. There is the possibility of a 20% discount on standard bikes.	
	It was suggested that more than one of bike should be offered, and that they should be leased to the students at a peppercorn rent. This would mean that they would be more likely to look after them, and would provide a small income.	
	It was queried if sponsorship could be sought for the purchase of the bikes. They could display the university name and the sponsor's name.	
	It was unclear if every student will require a bike for the entire period of their studies.
