Name	Fastershire Project Board Formerly Borders Broadband Herefordshire & Gloucestershire Project Board		
Project Purpose	The Fastershire Project is a partnership between Herefordshire Council and Gloucestershire County Council that has been in place since 2011. It aims to improve broadband availability across the two counties in order to enable businesses, communities and individual households to become more productive, competitive and sustainable.		
	The project is governed by a formal Partnership Agreement between the two authorities.		
	The project also works closely with UK Government through Broadband Delivery UK a key funder and enabler.		
	The primary emphasis of Fastershire has been to extend the reach of high speed broadband and seeks to improve the adoption and exploitation of broadband for the wider benefit of the local economy and community.		
	The ultimate aim of Fastershire is to reach as many properties with superfast broadband as possible. The Fastershire definition of superfast broadband remains at the EU 2020 standard of 30Mbps though increasingly moving to full-fibre delivery where it proves value for money to do so.		
	The Project has significant public sector resources available to it to provide funding to suppliers who have been procured to deliver the technical solution. These resources will be drawn from local, national and EU funds as well as investment from the private sector.		
	Where appropriate, other funding will be harnessed to deliver other activity outside of the extensive contracts which contributes to the delivery of the vision.		
	The Project Board oversees the implementation of the Fastershire Broadband Strategy 2019-22 and the achievement of the vision that: <i>Fastershire will enable all residents and businesses in Herefordshire and Gloucestershire to access the connectivity they need and encourage people to use faster broadband to do more online, boost business growth and achieve their potential.</i>		
	 Coverage – to continue to increase superfast broadband coverage across two counties through a mixture of contracts and grants, opting for Gbps capable or full-fibre broadband where value for money allows. Inclusion – to support residents and businesses to make the most of the broadband network through skills training, awareness raising and enabling community led schemes. Innovation – to continuously drive innovation in addressing the ambitions of broadband coverage in working with partners, funders, suppliers and the community. Monitoring – to ensure the maximum results from the work of suppliers by monitoring the contracts and driving value for money in deployments. Partnerships – to productively work with suppliers, parish and town councils on effective communications, with council departments to co-ordinate the approach to deployment, and planning authorities to ensure new premises have broadband connectivity.

Each authority will follow its own governance process for formal decision making. Operational decisions may be taken by the Project Executive and Gloucestershire Senior User under scheme of delegation of each authority with the Board as a platform for discussion, understanding risk, measure progress and give direction to the Project Team. Additionally the Project Board excluding the Senior Suppliers have the delegated authority to decide on operational contract changes, delegate delivery to the Project Team. Specific activities will be delegated to a Strategic Operational Meeting or other subject specific groups in order that the required expertise may be harnessed to inform a particular element of the project. Decisions resulting from these groups affecting the scope of the project or budget will require the endorsement of the Project Board before being implemented.
