If you currently receive home care or supported living services through Herefordshire Council, and you pay the full cost for your care, the hourly charges you will pay are:

- **The current upper capital limit**

If you have financial assets (excluding the home you live in) valued below the upper capital limit of £23,250, we will carry out a financial assessment to work out the maximum amount you can afford to pay each week towards your care and support. If the value of your capital is above the lower capital limit of £14,250 but below £23,250, for every £250 or part of £250 over the lower limit, £1 will be taken into account as weekly income. This will be added to your normal income in order to work out how much you will be asked to pay. If you have financial assets (excluding the home you live in) valued above the upper capital limit of £23,250, you will be classed as a self-funder and will not be entitled to financial support from the council. This means you will need to pay the full cost for the services you receive.

- **Charges for self-funders**

For self-funders with financial assets above the upper capital limit of £23,250, whilst you are not entitled to financial support from the council, if you have eligible care needs, you can ask the council to arrange your care on your behalf. If you ask us to arrange your care for you, we will charge you a flat rate fee of £100. This will cover the council's costs of finding a care provider and negotiating a rate on your behalf; the provider will charge you directly for the services you receive. If you ask the council to arrange your care for you by entering into a contract with a care provider, we will charge you an administration fee to cover our costs. This covers the council's costs for making payments to your care provider and sending invoices for your care charges. These charges are in addition to your care fees.

What the charge is for: A flat rate fee for arranging care and support on your behalf	How much it costs: £100	When the charge applies: An invoice will be sent to you after we have arranged your care
An administration fee for managing your care and support contract on your behalf	£9.50	An invoice will be sent each time we charge you for the services you've received, usually every four weeks
