<u>C1262, Much Marcle</u> from its junction with the C1294 to a point 180 metres north east of its junction with the C1301 and <u>C1294, Much Marcle</u> from its junction with A449 to a point 380 metres north west of its junction with the C1262.

This Order will come into operation on 11 June 2018.

- 2. No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour along the following lengths of road:

C1262, Much Marcle

From its junction with the C1294 to a point 180 metres north east of its junction with the C1301.

C1294, Much Marcle

From its junction with A449 to a point 380 metres north west of its junction with the C1262.

- 3. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within Regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemption (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with Regulation 3(5) of those regulations.
- 4. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order, the following Order will be revoked in its entirety from the date mentioned in Article 1 hereto:


