DRAFT PRIORITIES

3. Keeping children and young people safe, in supportive environments – early help, helping children to feel safe.

4. Building up child friendly communities – inclusive communities, increasing participation and influence of CYP.

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Early Help Approach Herefordshire 2018

- What is early help?
- Early help is designed to provide help for children and families as soon as problems start to emerge or when there's a strong likelihood that problems will emerge in the future.
- In Herefordshire, our aim is to provide the right support at the right time to meet a family's needs. This will help to improve the family's outcomes and build resilience to enable them to find their own solutions to any future challenges they may face.



What is Herefordshire's Approach?


- Our approach is aimed at all families with a child / children aged 0 to 19 years old or up to 25 years old for those with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) and is linked to the Herefordshire levels of Need threshold and the Families First Programme.
- Early Help supports levels 2 & 3 on the Herefordshire levels of need.
- Level 1 is for all families: Information, advice and support is offered through universal services such as schools, GPs, early year's provision, colleges and health visitors. WISH.

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• Level 4 – Safeguarding.



Herefordshire Levels of Need



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Early Help supports level 2 and 3

Levels 2 and 3

Children or young people with identified or emerging needs that require a coordinated approach For families with emerging issues and more complex needs: An assessment of the whole family's needs helps both the family and the services supporting them to work together more effectively.

An Early Help Assessment is completed by a professional of the family's choice and a package of support is agreed with them, such as additional help and support via early year's settings, children's centre services, school, health visitor, school nurse, counselling, specialist family support, Vennture4Family or Homestart volunteer.



Examples of support available

- Parenting advice and support
- Help with getting a job or accessing benefits
- Budgeting and debt management support
- Support with mental health issues
- Support to access other services which may provide additional help
- Evidence based parenting courses: Solihull, Triple P standard and teen
- Specialist assessment and support for Young Carers
- Early Help telephone support 01432 260261

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Early Help data

- At the end of March 2018 **552** active early help cases with 76 new cases registered in March 2018.
- Families First programme 2015 2020
 895 families have been identified and engaged
 198 families have achieved sustainable changes in all identified areas for a minimum of 6 months.



Early Help Strategy 2018 forwards

- The 2015-2018 strategy is now up for review and revision.
- As Early Help is all of our responsibility your help and support in completing this is essential.
