

Adults and wellbeing Integrated Sexual Health service for Herefordshire

Information

Herefordshire Council currently commissions a Sexual Health service which includes 3 different levels of sexual health care. The 3 different levels include information and advice about managing your own sexual health, testing and treatment for infection and provision of varying types of contraception. You can access some of these services at community pharmacies, but most are available from the sexual health clinic in Commercial Road, Hereford.

A public consultation ran between 2 July and 31 July 2018 to obtain the views of residents with regards to experience of the service since the current contract period began in December 2015. The consultation also sought to understand the most common reason for attending the service, whether it is easy to access, whether individuals could be seen at a time that suited them as well as obtaining feedback regarding the online STI test kits.

In addition Herefordshire Council is keen to ensure service locations are placed appropriately according to need and therefore the consultation was used to gather opinion on the location of service provision.

329 respondents completed the survey either online or in paper. The results of the consultation are detailed in the report below.

Section 1: Access

186 respondents had used the service since December 2015 (the current contract period), of these 104 accessed vis drop-in clinics and 56 preferred to book in advance. The majority, however, did not have a preference for either advance or drop in clinics.

Most respondents would prefer drop in clinic availability on a daily basis however a significant proportion also felt 2-3 times per week to be sufficient. Comparing these results with the additional comments left by respondents suggests that availability whether daily of 2-3 times per week should also include evenings.

The vast majority of respondents had not have any difficulties in accessing the service caused by problems with transport. This is reassuring but feedback relating to service location suggests that a significant number of individuals would like service access more locally to them.

Most respondents were able to be seen when they requested to be, there were a small number of comments that suggested waiting times at drop in clinics had been an issue for them.

Several respondents attended the clinic for more than 1 purpose, however the most common purpose was for STI testing followed by access for contraception and thirdly to obtain advice and information.

The majority of respondents had not accessed 121 support at the service however a significant number of individuals had.

The majority of respondents would be happy to access some service provision within community pharmacies and Hereford City was listed as the most popular location choice for most people. Both Leominster and Ross-on-Wye were preferred by a significant number of respondents followed by Ledbury and Kington.

A small number of respondents listed Hay-on-Wye as a preferred location for services although this was not included in the original survey options, similarly Wales was listed as a preferred location but was not listed in the survey options (and does not fall within the local authority area for this service).

Section 4: Online testing

Most respondents had not used the online testing kits although a significant proportion ad, most of those who had used an online testing kit would use them again and the majority of people surveyed would recommend them to others.

Some of the additional comments left included concern about the validity of online tests, difficulty in using them or lack of availability of testing kits available from the online service.

Section 5: Further Information

Most respondents left their demographic information, analysis of this demonstrated that although responses were received from both males and females ranging in age from under 15rs o 50+ years the majority were female aged between 25-34yrs.

The majority of respondents supplied a partial postcode for their usual place of residence, analysis of this demonstrated that most respondents resided within Herefordshire.
