### **DANGEROUS WILD ANIMALS ACT 1976**

### CONDITIONS SUBJECT TO WHICH THE ABOVE LICENCE IS GRANTED

### 1. General Conditions

- 1. While any animals are being kept under the authority of the Licence:
  - i. The animal shall be kept by no person other than the person or persons specified above;
  - ii. The animal shall normally be held at such premises as are specified above;
- iii. The animal shall not be moved from those premises except in the following circumstances, namely,
  - (a) To receive urgent veterinary attention
  - (b) If sold
  - (c) In any other circumstances agree in advance with the licensing authority
- iv. The licence-holder shall provide a means of identifying all animals that are subject to the licence. The licenceholder shall ensure that the system is maintained subject to such modifications as the licensing authority may from time to time require
- v. The licence-holder shall provide to the licensing authority on request a return containing the following information:
  - Total number of each species
  - Number of each aged 0-3 months and 6 months to 12 months
  - Number of each aged 12 months to 24 months and over 24 months
  - Number of eggs brought onto the unit (of each species)
  - Number of eggs sent off the unit (of each species)
  - Sales, purchases and deaths of birds
- vi. The licence-holder shall maintain a register containing the information referred to in condition 1 v. together with the names and addresses of persons from whom birds or eggs are purchased or to whom birds or eggs are sold. The register must be kept on the licensed premises and be available at all times for inspection by any person authorised by the Licensing Authority.
- vii. The person to whom the licence is granted shall hold a current insurance policy, which insures him and any other person entitled to keep the animal(s) under the authority of the licence against liability for any damage, which may be caused, by the animal(s). The terms of such policy being satisfactory in the opinion of the Licensing Authority.
- 2. The species and number of animals of each species that may be kept under the authority of this licence shall be restricted to those specified.
- 3. The person to whom the licence is granted shall at all reasonable times make available a copy of the licence to any person entitled to keep any animal under the authority of the licence.
- 4. The Licensing Authority and police shall be notified immediately of any animal(s) that escape from the licensed premises.

A sign displaying the name, address and telephone number of the licence-holder (or other responsible person) must be displayed in a prominent position on the premises.

### 2. Fire Precautions

1. Appropriate steps shall be taken for the protection of the animal(s) in case of fire or other emergency.

### 3. Animal Welfare Requirements

- 1. Living vegetation must be available for the animals to graze on and suitable supplementary foods must be provided as necessary.
- 2. A supply of grit (such as insoluble granite or limestone) must be available at all times.
- 3. A supply of clean fresh water must be available at all times.
- 4. Dry shelters must be available and suitable for the number of animals proposed to be accommodated at all times to protect them from inclement weather. Shelters must have a minimum height of 3.75m and a minimum floor area of 4m.sq. per animal, and must not expose the animals to the risk of injury.
- 5. Adequate exercise paddocks must be provided suitable for the number of animals held and be arranged in such a manner as to prevent undue stress or harm.
- 6. Restraint facilities must be provided for full size animals.
- 7. Animals must be handled and treated in such a manner so as not to cause undue stress or harm.
- 8. All reasonable precautions shall be taken to prevent and control the spread among the animals of infectious c Suitable veterinary first aid equipment and medicines shall be provided and maintained at the premises.
- 9. The animals shall be visited at suitable intervals.
- 10. Adequate facilities must be made available for the isolation of sick animals.

#### 4. Animal Containment

- 1. All paddocks and pens in which animals are housed or exercised must be completely enclosed by fencing. This fencing must be conspicuous, at least 1.65m high, and strong enough to withstand collision by animals using the paddock. All securing rails and fixtures to protrude no further than necessary and to present no feature which could cause damage to the animal(s).
- 2. Any gates accessing the enclosures must be kept padlocked shut at all times.
- 3. Safe procedures/practices must be employed whilst on-loading/off-loading birds from vehicles to prevent escape.

#### 5. Public Safety

- 1. Suitable warning signs must be posted at the main entrance to the premises and on any fences adjacent to areas which the public have access to, advising that dangerous wild animals are kept on the premises.
- 2. No shooting or hunting shall take place over land occupied by the animals. Suitable Prohibition Notices must be erected along the perimeter of the premises.
- **3.** Notices giving details of emergency facilities, fire extinguishers, etc. must be displayed in a prominent position near the main entrance to the premises.

Where necessary we may have to share this personal data with partner organisations for the protection of public funds administered which may include the prevention or detection of fraud and auditing purposes.
