Re: Little Birch and Aconbury Regulation 16 draft Neighbourhood Development Plan

Dear Neighbourhood Planning Team,

I refer to the above and would make the following comments with regard to the above proposed development plan.

It is my understanding that you do not require comment on Core Strategy proposals as part of this consultation or comment on sites which are awaiting or have already been granted planning approval.

Given that no other specific sites have been identified in the plan I am unable to provide comment with regard to potential contamination.

General comments:

Developments such as hospitals, homes and schools may be considered 'sensitive' and as such consideration should be given to risk from contamination notwithstanding any comments. Please note that the above does not constitute a detailed investigation or desk study to consider risk from contamination. Should any information about the former uses of the proposed development areas be available I would recommend they be submitted for consideration as they may change the comments provided.

It should be recognised that contamination is a material planning consideration and is referred to within the NPPF. I would recommend applicants and those involved in the parish plan refer to the pertinent parts of the NPPF and be familiar with the requirements and meanings given when considering risk from contamination during development.

Finally it is also worth bearing in mind that the NPPF makes clear that the developer and/or landowner is responsible for securing safe development where a site is affected by contamination.

These comments are provided on the basis that any other developments would be subject to application through the normal planning process.

REGULATION 14 PUBLIC CONSULTATION ON LITTLE BIRCH & ACONBURY NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN, FEBRUARY 2018

I refer to your email dated the 5th January 2018 regarding the above consultation. Welsh Water appreciates the opportunity to respond and we offer the following representation:

Given that the Neighbourhood Plan has been prepared in accordance with the Herefordshire Council Core Strategy, we are supportive of the aims, objectives and policies set out.

We note that there is no Welsh Water operated public sewerage infrastructure within the Neighbourhood Plan area, and as such would advise that alternative foul water disposal methods will be required on any new development in line with Policy SD4 of the Core Strategy.

With regard to water supply, there are no issues envisaged in the water supply network being able to accommodate the level of growth proposed. Off-site water mains may be required in order to connect a site to the existing network, dependant on site location.

LITTLE BIRCH AND ACONBURY REGULATION 16 NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN CONSULTATION

Thank you for forwarding me details of the submission consultation for the Little Birch and Aconbury Neighbourhood Plan (LANP).

Highways England is responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Strategic Road Network (SRN) in England. The network includes all major motorways and trunk roads. We are committed to supporting Government objectives on economic growth and sustainable transport, and recognise the need for closer integration of transport and land use planning as set out in the Department for Transport (DfT) Circular 02/2013 'The Strategic Road Network and the Delivery of Sustainable Development'.

The SRN in the area of Little Birch and Aconbury comprises the A49 Trunk Road which passes through the west of the Neighbourhood Plan area.

We recognise that the Neighbourhood Plan considers the need to conform to the policies set out within the adopted Herefordshire Local Plan Core Strategy and that the plan therefore considers key development allocations including housing.

Policy LBA7: Infrastructure sets out in paragraph 2 proposals for the creation of a cycle/footway link alongside the A49 between Kings Pitt Road and the C1263 at Cross in Hand Farm. We are happy to engage with the community to consider these proposals. However we have identified that the policy wording will require amendment to reflect the fact that evidence is not available regarding the practicability of the delivery of such a facility. Evidence would be necessary to demonstrate that such a link is the most appropriate option and that it could be delivered in principle without implications for the safe operation of the A49.

To develop these proposals further suitable feasibility work would need to be undertaken in cooperation with Highways England to determine the principles and

details. This would be necessary prior to the inclusion of a policy that specifically promoted these proposals over other such options. To ensure the plan can move forward we therefore recommend that the wording be amended to reference the need to consider a wider range of options.

Our recommended revision to the wording is included below with additional revised wording in **bold**.

Proposals which provide for the provision or improvement of walking, cycling and public transport infrastructure will be supported wherever feasible and appropriate, particularly where they deliver enhanced connectivity to existing facilities. This **may** include a cycle/footway link alongside the A49 between the Kings Pitt Road and the C1263 at Cross in Hand Farm **or other such facility** to provide enhanced access to the existing bus stop on the trunk road.

We would be happy to engage further with you to consider the potential of these proposals and can otherwise confirm we have no concerns with regards to the policies set out within the NDP.

National Grid has appointed Wood to review and respond to development plan consultations on its behalf. We are instructed by our client to submit the following representation with regards to the above Neighbourhood Plan consultation.

About National Grid

National Grid owns and operates the high voltage electricity transmission system in England and Wales and operate the Scottish high voltage transmission system. National Grid also owns and operates the gas transmission system. In the UK, gas leaves the transmission system and enters the distribution networks at high pressure. It is then transported through a number of reducing pressure tiers until it is finally delivered to our customers. National Grid own four of the UK's gas distribution networks and transport gas to 11 million homes, schools and businesses through 81,000 miles of gas pipelines within North West, East of England, West Midlands and North London.

To help ensure the continued safe operation of existing sites and equipment and to facilitate future infrastructure investment, National Grid wishes to be involved in the preparation, alteration and review of plans and strategies which may affect our assets.

Specific Comments

An assessment has been carried out with respect to National Grid's electricity and gas transmission apparatus which includes high voltage electricity assets and high-pressure gas pipelines, and also National Grid Gas Distribution's Intermediate and High-Pressure apparatus.

National Grid has identified that it has no record of such apparatus within the Neighbourhood Plan area.
