## **Hereford Transport Package Timeline**



2016: Undertook engineering, environmental research, identified issues and started traffic surveys



Early 2017: Public consultation 1 to introduce Hereford Transport Package and get public feedback



2017-2018: Engineering, environmental surveys, further traffic surveys and development and assessment of possible bypass routes. Identified and assessed walking, cycling, bus and public space improvements



**Early 2018:** Public consultation 2 to present the possible bypass routes and walking, cycling, bus and public space improvements



2018: Further technical survey and design work. Development and assessment of the preferred bypass route. Development and assessment of walking, cycling, bus and public space improvements



Summer 2018: Preferred bypass route confirmed by cabinet for further development and consent



Early 2019: Public consultation to present and gather feedback on walking, cycling, bus and public space improvements





Summer/Autumn 2019: Consultation to present the detailed designs on Hereford bypass and walking, cycling, bus and public space improvements



Winter 2019: Prepare and submit planning application for bypass.

Prepare programme for delivery of walking, cycling, bus and public space improvements



2022 onwards: Phased opening of bypass
