## HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (A40 THREE CROSSES, ROSS-ON-WYE) (40 MPH SPEED LIMIT AND SPEED DERESTRICTION) ORDER 2019

Notice is hereby given that the County of Herefordshire District Council, known as Herefordshire Council, in exercise of its enabling powers under section 82(2) (a) and 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 has made the above named order the effect of which is as follows: that no motor vehicle shall exceed a speed of 40 mph on the A40 Three Crosses, Ross-on-Wye from a point 49 metres south of the junction of the A40 with the A449/B4234/A40 (Trunk) Over Ross Roundabout to a point 187 metres south of the outer circumference of the A40/Old Tannery Way roundabout, and by means of a derestriction order no motor vehicle shall exceed the national speed limit (a) from the junction of the A40 with the A449/B4234/A40 (Trunk) Over Ross Roundabout for a distance of 49 metres in a southerly direction; and (b) between a point 187 metres south of the outer circumference of the A40/Old Tannery Way roundabout and a point 24 metres north of the junction of the A40 with the A40/B4260 Hildersley roundabout. **This Order will come into operation on 12**th **September 2019**

### **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

# HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (A40 THREE CROSSES, ROSS-ON-WYE) (40 MPH SPEED LIMIT AND SPEED DERESTRICTION) ORDER 2019

The County of Herefordshire District Council, known as Herefordshire Council in exercise of its powers under sections 82 (2) (a) and 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act of 1984 (referred to as "the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Paragraph 20 of Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:

- 1. The Order shall come into operation on 12 September 2019 and may be cited as "Herefordshire Council (A40 Three Crosses, Ross-on-Wye) (40 mph Speed Limit and Speed Derestriction) Order 2019".
- 2. No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour along the following length of road:

### A40 Three Crosses, Ross-on-Wye

Between a point 49 metres south of the junction of the A40 with the A449/B4234/A40 (Trunk) Over Ross Roundabout and a point 187 metres south of the outer circumference of the A40/Old Tannery Way roundabout.

and as shown for identification purposes only on the attached plan.

3. The following lengths of restricted road for the purposes of section 81 of the Act shall cease to be restricted roads as provided for under section 82 (2) (a) of the Act and thereby revert to the national speed limit so that no person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding the national speed Limit along the following lengths of road:

### A40 Three Crosses, Ross-on-Wye

- (a) From the junction of the A40 with the A449/B4234/A40 (Trunk) Over Ross Roundabout for a distance of 49 metres in a southerly direction.
- (b) Between a point 187 metres south of the outer circumference of the A40/Old Tannery Way roundabout and a point 24 metres north of the junction of the A40 with the A40/B4260 Hildersley roundabout.

and as shown for identification purposes only on the attached plan.


- 4. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within Regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemption (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with Regulation 3(5) of those regulations.
- References to any statutory provision herein shall include reference to any statutory modification substitution or re-enactment thereof.
