

HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL NOTICE OF MAKING ST OWENS CROSS

Notice is hereby given that Herefordshire Council, has made the Herefordshire Council (A4137 and B4521 St Owens Cross) (40 mph and 50 mph speed limit) Order 2014 the effect of which will be to introduce the following:

40 mph speed limit : A4137 - from a point 292 metres north of the western arm of the B4521 at St Owens Cross crossroads for a distance of 557 metres in a southerly direction. **B4521** Western arm of St Owens Cross crossroads - from its junction with the A4137 for a distance of 358 metres in a westerly direction. **B4521** Eastern arm of St Owens Cross crossroads. - between its junction with the A4137 and its junction with the A49.

50 mph speed limit: A4137 - from a point 265 metres south of the western arm of the B4521 at St Owens Cross crossroads for a distance of 710 metres in a southerly direction. **This Order will become operational on 30 June 2014.** A copy of the Order, with plan and Statement of Reasons and previous speed limit order to be revoked may be viewed at the Council's offices at Brockington, 35 Hafod Rd, Hereford HR1 1SH (tel: 01432 260000) and the Ross on Wye Customer Service Centre, Ross Library, Cantilupe Road Ross on Wye, HR9 7AN (tel: 01432 260500). If any person wishes to question the validity of this Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that they are not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or that any requirement of the said Act or any instrument made under that Act has not been complied with that person may do so by application to the High Court within six weeks from the date the Order was made.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

(A4137 AND B4521 ST OWENS CROSS) (40 MPH AND 50 MPH SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2014

The County of Herefordshire District Council known as Herefordshire Council, in exercise of its powers under Section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the said Act hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Herefordshire Council (A4137 and B4521 St Owens Cross) (40 mph and 50 mph Speed Limit) Order 2014 and shall come into operation on the 30 June 2014.

2. No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour along the following lengths of road:

A4137 St Owens Cross.

Between a point 292 metres north of where the centre line of the western arm of the B4521 at St Owens Cross crossroads intersects the centre line of the A4137 and a point 265 metres south of where the centre line of the western arm of the B4521 at St Owens Cross crossroads intersects the centre line of the A4137 .

B4521 - Western arm of St Owens Cross crossroads.

From its junction with the A4137 for a distance of 358 metres in a westerly direction.

B4521 - Eastern arm of St Owens Cross crossroads

Between its junction with the A4137 and the A49.

And as shown for identification purposes only on the attached plan

3. No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour along the following lengths of road:

A4137 St Owens Cross.

Between a point 265 metres south of where the centre line of the western arm of the B4521 at St Owens Cross crossroads intersects the centre line of the A4137 and a point 975 metres south of where the centre line of the western arm of the B4521 at St Owens Cross crossroads intersects the centre line of the A4137.

And as shown for identification purposes only on the attached plan.

4. No speed limit imposed by this Order applies to vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemption (Special Forces) (Variation Amendment) Regulations 2011 when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those regulations.

5. Without prejudice to the validity of anything done or to any liability incurred in respect of any act or omission before the coming into operation of this Order the following speed limit order (and the provisions contained in any other previous such orders) that relate to the lengths of road subject to this Order which are in operation prior to the date mentioned in Article 1 of this Order will be revoked in their entirety from the date mentioned in the said Article 1

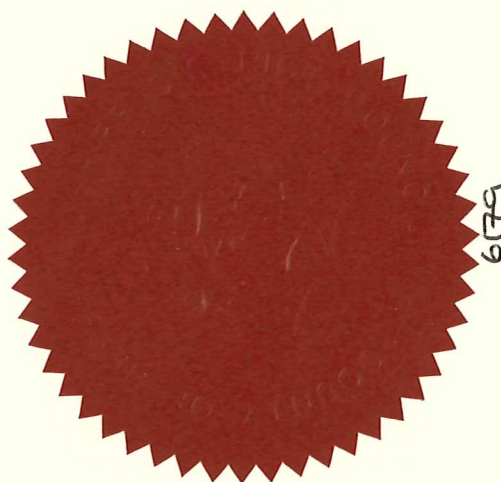

5. Reference to any statutory provisions herein shall include reference to any statutory modification or re-enactment thereof.

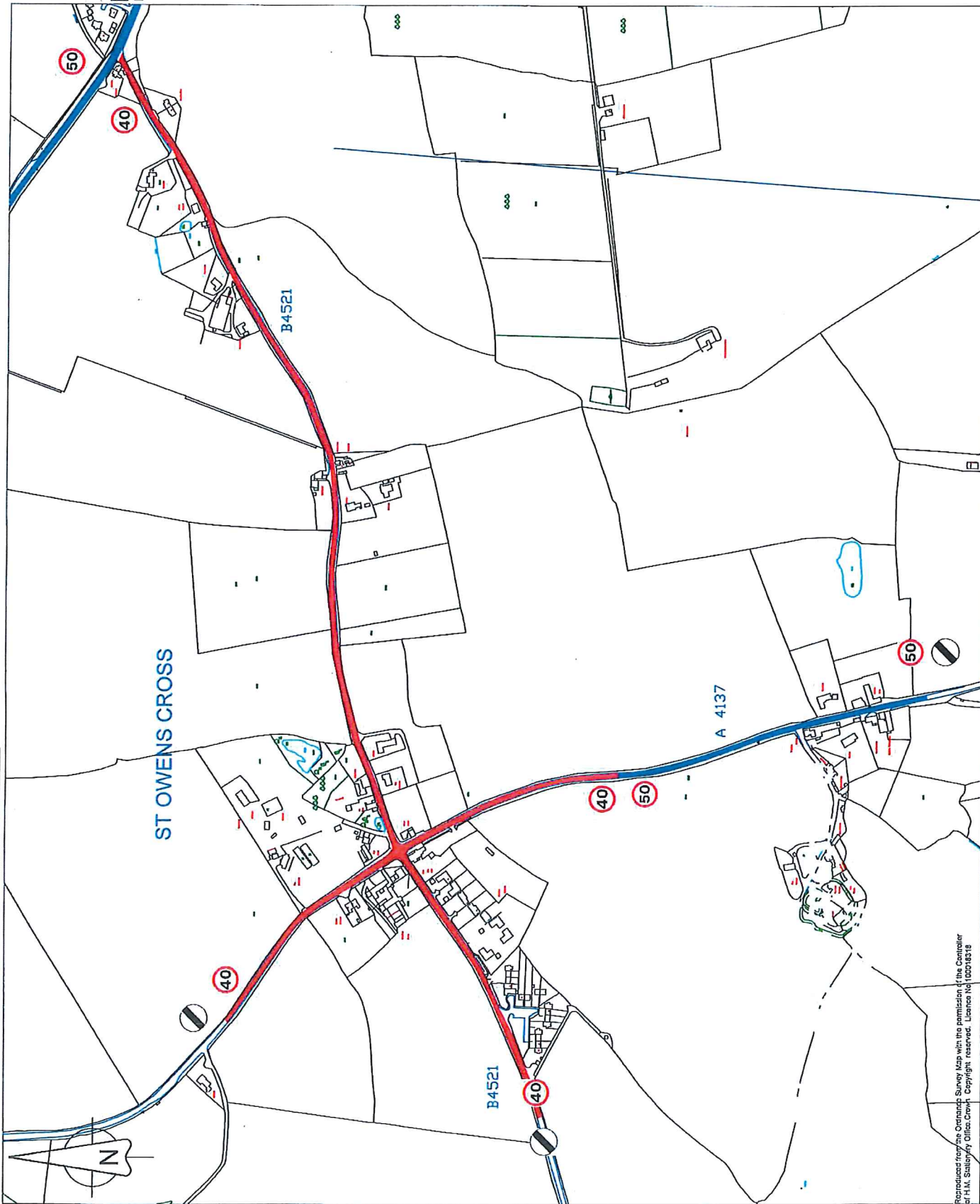

The County of Herefordshire District Council in exercise of its powers under section 84 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order:-


1. No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour along the B4521 from a point 360 metres west of its junction with the west side of the A4137 for a distance of 518 metres in an easterly direction.
2. No person shall drive a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour along the A4137 from a point 156 metres north of its junction with the centre line of the B4521 for a distance of 1,137 metres in a southerly direction.

as shown for identification purposes only on the attached plan.

3. Reference to any statutory provision herein shall include reference to any statutory modification or re-enactment thereof.
4. This Order may be cited as The County of Herefordshire District (B4521 and A4137 St. Owens Cross) (40 and 50 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 2002 and shall come into operation on the 17th day of July 2002.
