### **ORDER 2020**

Notice is hereby given that the County of Herefordshire District Council, known as Herefordshire Council, in exercise of its powers under Sections 1 and 2 of Part 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (referred to as the "Act") and all its enabling powers has made the above named order, the effect of which will be to prohibit loading and unloading at any time on the following stretches of road;

**B4203 New Road (North Western Side)** From its junction with High Street in a south westerly direction for a distance of 15 metres; **B4203 New Road (South Eastern Side)** From its junction with High Street in a south westerly direction for a distance of 34 metres; **B4203 High Street (South Western Side)** From its junction with New Road in a north westerly direction for a distance of 13 metres; **B4203 High Street (South Western Side)** From its junction with New Road in a north westerly direction for a distance of 13 metres; **B4203 High Street (South Western Side)** From its junction with New Road in a south easterly direction for a distance of 13 metres; **B4203 High Street (South Western Side)** From its junction with New Road in a south easterly direction for a distance of 13 metres.

This Order will become operational on 30 November 2020.

Any representations received by the Council may be imparted to third parties. We will keep your data for up to 7 years. #### **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984**

#### HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCIL (NEW ROAD & HIGH STREET, BROMYARD) (PROHIBITION OF LOADING AND UNLOADING AT ANY TIME) ORDER 2020

The County of Herefordshire District Council ("the Council"), known as Herefordshire Council in exercise of its powers under Sections 1 and 2 of Part 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act of 1984 (referred to as "the Act") and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Paragraph 20 of Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act hereby makes the following Order:

- 1. The Order shall come into operation on **30** Nor 2020 and may be cited as Herefordshire Council (New Road and High Street, Bromyard) (Prohibition of Loading and Unloading at Any Time) Order 2020.
- 2. (1) In this Order,

"Civil Enforcement Officer" means a person appointed in accordance with the provisions of section 76 Traffic Management Act 2004.

- 3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Officer or of a Civil Enforcement Officer in uniform, cause or permit any vehicle to load or unload at any time in the lengths of road specified in the schedule to this Order and for identification purposes only as has been shown on the attached plan.
- 4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in those lengths of road specified in the schedule to this Order for so long as maybe necessary to enable: -

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(a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle

(b) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used for the delivery or removal of plant/or materials for any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the side of those lengths of road referred to, or the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or near the said sides of those lengths of road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined in the Communications Act 2003.

(c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

(d) the vehicle to be used for the purposes of delivering or collecting postal packets

(e) the vehicle to be used for the purposes of removing furniture and effects from one office or dwelling house to another, or to such premises from a depository or from such premises to a depository, provided notice is given twenty-four hours in advance to the council, their consent is obtained and such reasonable conditions as they impose are complied with;

(f) the vehicle to be used for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes.

(g) the vehicle to be used for the purposes of collecting waste or recyclables or street cleansing.

- 5. The restrictions, prohibitions and requirements imposed by this Order are in addition to and not in derogation of any restriction, prohibition or requirement imposed by any other enactment and any exception or exemption to the provisions of this Order is without prejudice to the provisions of any other enactment.
- 6. References to any statutory provision herein shall include reference to any statutory modification substitution or re-enactment thereof.
