Age	Y			Strategy offers Improved facilities for students aged 16-19 at the new Beacon College. It puts them on a par with the facilities at other mainstream colleges in Hereford and indeed offers access to the facilities of the colleges.
Disability	Y		Y	All of the building projects are designed to improve the quality of accommodation for different groups of SEND, some of which is in very poor condition. Improving the facilities will give the message that we value our most vulnerable pupils/students. In some cases, additional facilities will reduce reliance on schools outside of the County, removing travel times.  There have been 2 challenges for very specific groups resulting from the proposed closure of the 6th form at Westfield Special School 1. for those living very close to Leominster are likely to have a longer journey than currently although the average travel time for students is calculated by the transport team to be similar.  2. The same closure of the 6th form has been questioned in terms of where students are currently will be accessing work experience opportunities and will this dislocate them from their home communities.
