Introductions

Tracy welcomed everyone and asked everyone to introduce themselves. Tracy then went through the Zoom etiquette.

John Gorman recapped the previous minutes from the 13th July.

Matter Arising

Easy Read Market Position Statement – Paul said work on this was ongoing and that he had been delayed in working on this due to working on the easy read Day Services Engagement Survey.

Create Working Group to design Surveys in regards to the Day Activities Re-Design Engagement going on-John and Jas put together a working group which has helped design the Day Activities Engagement Survey-see Engagement Item below for more information.

LeDeR Annual Report 2021/22 -Rachael Skinner, Associate Director of Nursing Equality, H & W CCG & Lead Co-ordinator LeDeR programme

Rachael talked the board through her presentation on the findings from the LeDeR Annual Report regrading Herefordshire and Worcestershire. She also discussed the priorities for the region that will form part of the 3 Year Plan being developed for April 2022. (See presentation Attached)

Key extra points from LeDeR Report over the last year that Rachael added include:

- People with a learning disability in Herefordshire live slightly longer than the National Average across England. The average age of death over the past 4 years in Herefordshire (61 for woman and 64 for men) was similar to the average in England (60 for women and 61 for men). Over the past 12 months the average of death for women had shot up (70s) due to the low number involved.
- In Herefordshire at least 55% of people have been supported to die at home over the past 3 years. Rachael noted this is currently above the national average for England where most people with learning disabilities die in acute hospital beds.
- Deaths from COVID 19 in Herefordshire and Worcestershire are below the national average in England and the West Midlands.
- Local people have higher than the national average levels of underlying health conditions such as mental illness, epilepsy and constipation.-Rachael said this could be due to better diagnosis but this needs to be investigated.
- Rachael also highlighted they are going to be training clinicians on ReSPECT(Recommended Summary Plan for Emergency Care Treatment) and promoting the public on the scheme.
- Still issues in Herefordshire around the mental capacity assessment or best interest decisions around people understanding the format in which it is written or patients not understand the potential consequences when refusing treatment.
- People with Autism but who do not have a learning disability will be included in the LeDeR programme at some point next year.

Mary raised the point of how can you have accurate figures and comparisons if the benchmarks keep changing year on year. She highlighted the need for compare learning disability figures against the general population and not just the previous year's LD demographic.

Rachael highlighted that the CCG has been working with Public Heath in both Herefordshire and Worcestershire to update the JSNP to better understand the health needs of people with a learning disability and the ways they are disadvantaged verses the general population.

Bill of Rights- Scrutiny Feedback-Jon Gorman

John explained how the Scrutiny Committee wanted to help the Board promote the Bill Of Rights to the learning disability community. John suggested inviting Micala Lee from Corporate to the next meeting to hear her suggestions.

Healthwatch- Reasonable Adjustments-Mary Simpson-

Mary discussed how Healthwatch had produced Infographics, detailed guides and MECC Plus training resources for various disabilities on specific reasonable adjustment that organisations and businesses can make. Mary is still working to get funding to do the Mental Health the detailed guide for this is complete.

Supported Living update-John

John explained that Cabinet had given their approval for Laura to conduct a review of the current supported living arrangements and framework over the next 12 months. This will include an engagement process. Laura will explain the timetable and how people can get involved at the next meeting.

Engagement Re-design of Day Opportunities-Jas Kakkar

Jas discussed how she and John had been doing some thorough engagement in what the new model could look like. With the help individual and provider they have finalised the survey. The survey will shared though providers, Community LD team and through the LDPB webpage and will be available in Word, PDF and SNAP form.

The engagement process should last 4 weeks with Jas initially hoping to have feedback by the next board meeting. The survey itself had a closing date of the 15th of October. Hard copies of the survey will be available at Plough Lane and at the PPE store.

Please note; there was a slight delay to the on line version of the survey going live as it had to be made compliant with the Councils' WCAG2.1 accessibility regulations. This has now been done and the survey went live W/C 20 September.

Speak Easy Now Forum-Tracy

Tracy and Mike both went to the Worcestershire's Speak Easy Now Forum held over Zoom. Speak Easy is now is a self-advocacy group that works closely with Worcestershire's County Council and their Learning Disability Partnership Board. Ian mentioned that that Speak Easy had been involved in setting up various groups such as Health checkers and Peoples Parliament in Worcestershire.

Healthwatch-Mary

Mary mentioned that Healthwatch has 2 new members of staff. 1 new part time Engagement Officer named Sam Jenkins who will working on a new digital project helping people understand how to use the internet.

There is also a new employee working with Turning Point getting participant feedback on the service they receive.

Healthwatch has also held a meeting with the Voluntary and Community Sector about the ICS (Integrated Care System). Healthwatch wants to help set up a community partnership to better link community and voluntary sector with statutory services.

Echo-Mike Cook

Mike said Echo was looking to bring Yam Jams back in some form. He said an official announcement would be out in the coming weeks once they have found a venue and sorted out the COVID practices.

Any other Business

ICS (Integrated Care System) Learning Disability & Autism Programme Assurance Board-Richard

Richard explained how the ICS Learning Disability & Autism Programme Assurance Board had had replaced the STP (Sustainability and Transformation Programme) Learning Disability Programme Board and now includes Autism. He explained how the Integrated Care System has replaced the Sustainability and Transformation Programme.

He explained below that are two boards ICS LDA Tackling Health Inequalities Programme Board which focuses on Health Outcomes for people with a learning disability or autism and the ICS Developing Services for Autistic People Programme Board. These boards is where he expects the work to be done and people to be making the service improvements and to call people to account

Both these boards will report back to both counties LDPB and Autism Partnership Boards regularly.
