



PART B: Movement Worksheet Example



Part B is a Worksheet Example to accompany Part A Movement Information Guide. This example, gives an indication of what a movement study of your area could be like.



Street Hierarchy Information

Primary street:

Arterial, ring road or relief road with dedicated lanes for cycles and public transport, where possible.

High street:

Primary or Secondary street that acts as a focus for retail and other services

Secondary street:

Mainly carry local traffic and provide access into neighbourhoods; they are often the location of schools and community facilities and may also be residential streets in themselves.

Local street:

Residential streets with managed traffic flows to prioritise active travel. They provide access to homes and support active travel, social interaction and health and wellbeing.

Tertiary street:

With no through traffic, these are used for servicing or for access to small groups or clusters of homes. They can be lanes, mews courts, alleyways or cul-de-sacs.
