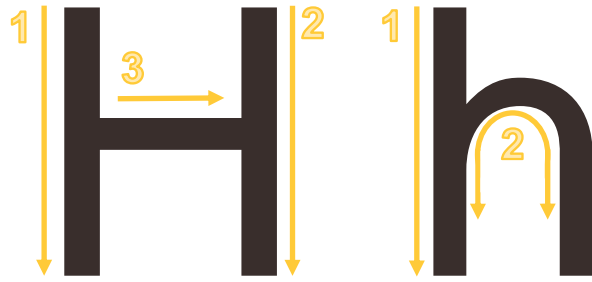
1. Page one: Learn to write the letter H

FUN FACTS!

Can you guess how big a footprint from a hedgehog is? The size of a 50p coin. Hedgehogs have very small prints, which can sometimes make it hard to identify them. Their prints look like little small human hands. That's because hedgehogs have 5 toes on their front paws. However, on their back paws they have 4 toes.

Their prints are the easiest way to spot if they have been around. Otherwise if you are a night owl you might be able to hear them as they are very noisy animals! Hedgehogs snuffle loudly as they shuffle through the undergrowth and call to each other with a high squeal. You need to remember that hedgehogs have poor eyesight but an acute sense of smell, touch and hearing.
