How to set up this activity?

Using the cards: Use the cards as a starting point. Print them out and place them upside down. Once shuffled, take a card and use it as the starting point of your story. Or take several cards to use as a start, middle, and end. We left one blank flashcard that you could draw to add to the card pile. You can use the drawings or even find a way to incorporate the phrases into your story.

No cards: Use your creativity to write a story about Spike or your very own hedgehog.




