

"I live with family".


"I live in a flat and support come and visit me for 2 hours a week"

Of those that wished to move:

- 3 wanted to find their own flat or place with support.
- 2 wanted shared house with 1 or
 2 other people with support.
- 1 person wanted a shared house with lots of people with support.
- 1 wanted sheltered housing with a warden on site.

- Learn more independence skills, move away from home after college.
- I would need independent living skills training. I would also need more money. I would need help travel training when I get to the new place to help find my feet.
- To understand how I get assessed and what help may be available. I will need help and that worries me that I wont get it not living at home with my Mum.

• I wouldn't mind a new place that had stairs. I don't need a bungalow. I have never lived on my own except at xxxxx college for a little bit and I used the canteen and staff came in to check on me a lot. I am not happy with my shared lives house. It feels like they don't care about me, and it makes me sad.

 Affinity Trust know me well and I would like them to help me live in the future.

Conclusion

- Many people that filled the survey are thinking about moving where they live in the next five years.
- Some people are happy where they are.
- They like many different types of homes with support.
- They would like support to achieve their moves and develop the skills they need to be more independent.



Possible response ideas

- Ways the board could help:
- Offer clear easy ways to access support to discuss and understand options available. (How and when are people with a learning Disability asked their views on their living arrangements and future aspirations?)
- Offer clear easy ways to access independent living skills training so that people can plan and live where they wish in the future.
- Consider whether there are enough housing and supported options to allow choice.
- Consider whether there is enough support for future housing wishes.
- Do you have any other suggestions?
