NOTES

To be eligible to apply for rural rate relief, the property must be situated in a rural settlement. A rural settlement must have a population of not more than 3,000 (estimated as at 31 December 2015) and must be in a defined rural area. Copies of the list of the rural settlements within the Herefordshire district are available for public inspection at Council offices.

A property will qualify for mandatory relief providing that it is within the boundaries of a qualifying rural settlement and,

- It has a rateable value of not more than £8500 if it is a general store or the sole post office or £12500 if it is the sole public house or filling station, and

- It is used in whole or in part, as a general store, post office, public house or filling station. A general store is one where business is carried on consisting wholly or mainly of the sale, by retail, of both food for human consumption (excluding confectionery) and general household goods, and

- It is either the only post office, public house or filling station in the settlement.

The ratepayer is eligible to apply for discretionary relief providing that it is within the boundaries of a qualifying rural settlement, and

- It meets the criteria for the granting of mandatory relief; or

-It has a rateable value of £14,000 or less and is used for the purposes of a business that is of benefit to the local community.
