1. Introduction

- **1.1** Herefordshire Council is in the process of preparing a new Local Plan for the County. Once adopted the new Herefordshire Local Plan 2021 -2041 will replace the existing Core Strategy (2015) and provide the framework for guiding development within the County through to 2041.
- **1.2** Between 17th January 2022 and 29th July 2022, the Council held early preliminary consultations on the key issues and challenges in Herefordshire and the various topic-based and place-based options for addressing these to form the basis of the new Local Plan 2041.
- **1.3** This document outlines how the Council has conducted early, proactive and inclusive engagement. Along with a summary of the issues raised during the consultation and how Council has responded to these issues.
- **1.4** This is the first consultation statement following the initial round of consultations. Further Consultation Statements will be issued after the Regulation 18 consultation on the full Draft Local Plan.

2. Statutory requirements

- 2.1 The consultation and engagement activities were carried out following the approach set out in Herefordshire Council's Statement of Community Involvement (SCI) published in January 2022, and of Regulation 22 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, which state that a Consultation Statement has to be produced to show:
 - which bodies and persons were invited to make representations;
 - how those bodies and persons were invited to make such; representations;
 - How those main issues have been addressed in Local Plan.
- **2.2** As required by the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) (paragraphs 15-16) this document demonstrates how we conducted early, proportionate, and effective engagement between council and communities, organisations, businesses, providers, operators, and statutory consultees when developing the new Local Plan.

3. Consultation Processes

3.1 What we consulted on

3.2 Herefordshire Council has undertaken several rounds of consultations while preparing the new Local Plan 2021-2041.To date, the following engagements and consultations have taken place:

- **3.3** These were the first consultations carried out by the Council in development of the new Local Plan. The consultation periods were intend to seek views on a number of different proposals on what the Local Plan should achieve, as well as potential strategies for delivering this. The consultations were structured as follows:
 - Spatial Options consultation covering the distribution of housing around the county. This first round of consultation presented different spatial options for distributing housing growth.
 - Policy Options consultation The second stage of consultation covered policy options and sought views on key policies covering a number of themes, including climate change, housing, employment and transport.
 - Place Shaping Consultation This round of consultations sought views on the strategic growth areas in Hereford, the market town and rural areas including a new rural settlement hierarchy.

3.4 Who we consulted

3.5 The Council consulted directly with a broad cross section of communities, stakeholders and interested parties during this early stage of consultations. Statutory and non-statutory consultees from the council's extensive consultation database were contacted. This database includes:

- Businesses based across the county
- Parish councils
- Community and voluntary groups
- Infrastructure providers
- Neighbouring authorities
- Government agencies
- Elected Members

3.6 How we consulted

- **3.7** The council employed a range of tools to enable as many residents stakeholders and interested parties, to have an opportunity to make representation and provide feedback through their preferred method.
- **3.8** Notification was sent to specified stakeholders, industry contacts, and statutory bodies such as Highways England and utility companies, neighbouring authorities, agents and land owners. The correspondence sent included details of where to find further information and how to make a representation either online or in writing.
- **3.9** The Council has continued to engage with neighbouring local authorities of Malvern Hills District Council, Forest of Dean District Council, and Shropshire Council to provide a forum to discuss cross-border and sub-regional planning issues. Further information will be provided in a future Duty to Cooperate Statement for the Regulation 19 consultation.
- **3.10** Residents, local community groups, elected members and other stakeholders were informed about ways to get involved in the consultations. Methods to respond both on and offline were given, in order to reach the broadest audience possible.
- 3.11 Using the online engagement platform 'Commonplace' we were able to create a dedicated site for the Herefordshire Local Plan 2021 2041. This site is accessible and user-friendly platform for the general public to access and provide their feedback the consultations. The online consultations platform were open and active throughout the consolation period. You can view all previous consultation material <u>here</u>.

3.12In line with government requirements on social distancing at the time, in-person consultations were paused in order to protect public health following the COVID-19 pandemic. A suitable alternative approach was implemented by using accessible video conferencing communication platforms (Microsoft Teams, Zoom) which followed a similar format to in-person sessions.

- **3.13**The Council was able to resume in-person consultations in a safe manner, following improvement in conditions. A number of consultation events were held across the county. These were attended by Planning Officers. A set of exhibition boards were displayed showing information on the various options, including maps. Questionnaires were also handed out seeking feedback.

4. Overview of the responses

- **4.1** This section summarises the feedback received from respondents the consultations. More detail on comments received can be found in Appendix A.
- **4.2** Over 1,600 responses were received from members of the public answering questions and providing their view on the various options. With 403 responses for the Vision & Objectives, 1,200 for Growth Levels & Strategic Spatial Options including the Rural Spatial Options, 250 for the Policy Options, and 460 for the Place Shaping via the online survey and additional responses via direct email.
