1. None of these objectives mention climate change. Emissions from transport in the UK are significant – excluding international travel, they now make up about 21% of our total emissions and are falling far more slowly than home heating and electricity generation. Our rural setting and low population density means that Herefordshire has higher per capita domestic transport emissions than the UK.

My suggestion is that you add a 6th objective to the Transport Plan which is to manage down transport emissions. For example you could set a goal to reduce emissions by at least 3% year on year to 2025.

- 2. Reducing travel distances. Objective 3 talks about making sure new developments maximise walking, cycling and bus use. Which implies developments will be sited in places where these travel modes are feasible. To support this, I would like to see derelict brownfield sites within Hereford City boundaries prioritised for housing development there are at least 2 such sites so that residents can plausibly use non-car modes of transport to get to work, to school and to shop. And so minimise the need to create new housing developments on greenfield sites which have longer travel distances, are in places not served by public transport or cycle infrastructure and therefore create demand for new roads and drive up car usage.
- 3. The benefits of 'active transport' Our local news is full of people griping about traffic congestion, the time it takes to get from A to B etc. All very stressful, and has a real cost in human lives and happiness. Here's what KPMG said recently

"Active cities are healthier, happier and more competitive than their couch potato peers. Designing physical activity into the infrastructure of a city means people move around more and reap the physical and psychological rewards.

Inactive populations are expensive by contrast. Physical inactivity will kill 9 percent of the population in the UK – as many as smoking1 – as well as vastly increasing the chance of developing heart disease, breast cancer and colon cancer. Physical activity and access to nature has also been shown to alleviate depression, reduce stress and improve general well being.2 It can also help promote creativity and provide space for families and communities to build relationships.

So city leaders need to create an environment that encourages activity as part of a daily routine."

Why shouldn't this last point be one of the Transport Plan Objectives?

4. The cost of the school run. It is acknowledged that in school terms, peak-time traffic levels in Hereford City rise significantly compared with school holidays. At some pinch points the increase is approaching 50%. None of the objectives given above explicitly target a change to the way pupils get to school. (although Question 10 below does ask if you think the money to be allocated to "safer routes to school" is correct)

It has recently been estimated that for every £1 spent in getting school pupils to cycle to school saves £539 in costs to NHS congestion; air pollution & accidents



1. None of these objectives mention climate change. Emissions from transport in the UK are significant – excluding international travel, they now make up about 21% of our total emissions and are falling far more slowly than home heating and electricity generation. Our rural setting and low population density means that Herefordshire has higher per capita domestic transport emissions than the UK.

My suggestion is that HCC add a 6th objective to the Transport Plan which is to manage down transport emissions. For example you could set a goal to reduce emissions by at least 3% year on year to 2025.

2. Reducing travel distances. Objective 3 talks about making sure new developments maximise walking, cycling and bus use, which implies developments

will be sited in places where these travel modes are feasible. To support this, I would like to see derelict brownfield sites within Hereford City boundaries prioritised for housing development – there are at least 2 such sites – so that residents can

plausibly use non-car modes of transport to get to work, to school and to shop, and so minimise the need to create new housing developments on greenfield sites which have longer travel distances, are in places not served by public transport or cycle

infrastructure and therefore create demand for new roads and drive up car usage.

If new roads are part-funded by 1000s new homes that generally add 2X1000s more vehicles to local roads, then the new roads cannot resolve a congestion issue. In this context of proposed radial urban expansion, new roads will actually always make congestion worse.

Spending priorities should be on sustainable transport, not new roads. New roads are very expensive (large numbers of consultants' reports even before the road is built) but measures such as adapting more footpaths to share with cyclists are much less expensive and yet could be very effective. There are many opportunities to promote sustainable transport in central Hereford that are not yet being considered. There are also many opportunities to improve existing road layouts and junctions to make them more efficient in keeping traffic flowing.

Shobdon is on the designated route from Kingspan Insulation eastwards also Kington quarries travelling to the Midlands as well as the main route from the adjacent town of Presteigne to Leominster/Hereford.

This results in over 4000 vehicles going through the village each day. Many of these are HGV's It would be appreciated if thought is given to upgrading the parish roads to withstand the excessive wear the roads are experiencing. We have the busiest B road in the area.

- 1. None of these objectives mention climate change. Emissions from transport in the UK are significant excluding international travel, they now make up about 21% of our total emissions and are falling far more slowly than home heating and electricity generation. Our rural setting and low population density means that Herefordshire has extremely high per capita domestic transport emissions in the comparison to the UK in general. A suggestion is that HCC add a 6th objective to the Transport Plan which is to manage down transport emissions. For example, they could set a goal to reduce emissions by at least 3% year on year to 2025.
- 2. Regarding reducing travel distances. Objective 3 talks about making sure new developments include plans to maximise walking, cycling and bus use. Which implies developments will be sited in places where these travel modes are feasible and practicable. To support this, I would like to see derelict brownfield sites within Hereford City boundaries prioritised for housing development there are at least 2 such sites so that residents can plausibly use non-car modes of transport confident of safety, to get to work, to school, to shop and to leisure activities. Crucially prioritising the stated aim. That is, aiming to minimise the need to create new housing developments on, (valuable for rural purposes), greenfield sites which have longer and more impractical travel distances, situated in places not served by public transport or pedestrian/cycle infrastructure and therefore create demand for new roads and drive up unwanted car usage. The Transport plan as is does not support it's stated aims sufficiently to be reasonable and acceptable as such.

  3. I would now highlight the benefits of an "active transport" scenario in Herefordshire area. Our local news is full of people griping about traffic congestion, the time it takes to get from A to B, the dangerous state of the near curb area for cyclists, and the real danger of the current system for cyclists and pedestrians alike etc. (Being a cyclist and pedestrian walking with children I personally am very much aware of the current danger. No surprise to me why so few cycle in Herefordshire urban areas. All very stressful, and has a real cost in human lives and happiness. Here's what KPMG said recently:

Quote: "Active cities are healthier, happier and more competitive than their couch potato peers. Designing physical activity into the infrastructure for citieds means people move around more and reap both physical and psychological rewards. Inactive populations are expensive by contrast. Physical inactivity will kill 9% of the population in the UK – as many as smoking – as well as vastly increasing the chance of developing heart disease, breast cancer and colon cancer. Physical activity and access to nature has also been shown to alleviate depression, reduce stress and improve general wellbeing. It can also help promote creativity and provide space for families and communities to build good relationships.

So city leaders need to create an environment that encourages activity as part of a daily routine."

I agree wholeheartedly with this quotation and guiding wisdom. I would ask you wholeheartedly to consider this last point as a sixth Transport Plan Objective.

Cost savings to the NHS are incredibly significant – estimated in 2012 at £17bn over the next 20 years: (please refer to; http://www.c3health.org/alerts/alerts-economics/saving-on-active-travel/).

4. The cost of the school run and it's practicality. It is acknowledged that school runs, in school terms, account for significant rises in peak-time traffic levels in Hereford City compared with school holidays. At some pinch points the increase is approaching 50%. None of the stated objectives above specifically and explicitly target this with a view to improvement. (Although Q 10 below does ask if you think money to be allocated to "safer routes to school" is correct.) It has recently been estimated that for every £1 spent in getting school pupils to cycle to school saves £539 in costs to NHS congestion; air pollution & accidents.
