


The road humps detailed above are proposed as part of the "Greening the City" improvements surrounding Great Western Way in Hereford.

# Proposed Road Humps – Penhaligon Way, Gladstone Drive and Aldi Access Road, Hereford

# **Proposals**

As part of the "Greening the City" initiative on Great Western Way, Hereford, it is proposed to introduce a new flat top road hump at the locations described in Schedule 1 below. The proposals are as follows:
