FOOTPATH BPF34 (PART) BISHOPS FROME
PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER 2025**

This Order is made by the County of Herefordshire District Council (known as "Herefordshire Council") under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 because it appears to Herefordshire Council that in the interests of the owner, lessee and occupier of the land crossed by the footpath described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order it is expedient that the line of the path should be diverted.

Melissa Ong and Richard Mitchelson, the said owners, have agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into force of this Order and to pay any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the footpath into a fit condition for use by the public.

BY THIS ORDER:

1. The public right of way over the land situated at The Dovehills in the parish of Bishops Frome and shown by a bold continuous line on the plan contained in this Order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order shall be stopped up on the date of confirmation of this Order.
2. There shall be on the date of confirmation of this Order a public footpath over the land situated at The Dovehills in the parish of Bishops Frome described in Part 2 of the Schedule to this Order and shown by a bold broken line on the said plan.
3. Where immediately before the date on which the said footpath is diverted there is apparatus under, in, on, over, along or across it belonging to statutory undertakers for the purpose of their undertakings, the undertakers shall continue to have the same rights in respect of the apparatus as they then had.
4. The rights conferred on the public under this Order shall be subject to the limitations and conditions set out in Part 3 of the Schedule to this Order.

SCHEDULE

PART 1

Description of Site of Existing Path or Way

The existing route of footpath BPF34 commences at OS Grid Reference SO 6732 5070 (point A on the order plan) and proceeds in a generally north-easterly direction for approximately 170 metres to a gap at OS Grid Reference SO 6747 5078 (point B on the order plan). The path continues in a generally east north-easterly direction for approximately 101 metres then in a generally easterly direction for approximately 141 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 6769 5084 (point C on the order plan).

The total length of the existing said footpath is approximately 412 metres.

PART 2

Description of Site of New Path or Way

The proposed new route of footpath BPF34 being 2 metres in width commences at OS Grid Reference SO 6732 5070 (point A on the order plan) and proceeds in a generally easterly direction for approximately 152 metres to a gap at OS Grid reference SO 6747 5072 (point D on the order plan). The path continues in a generally north-easterly direction for approximately 251 metres to OS Grid Reference SO 6769 5084 (point C on the order plan).

The total length of the said proposed new footpath is approximately 403 metres.
