5.2	Castle Green Pavilion	
5.2.1	IA advised that following previous Board decision, a Deed of Variation has now been issued to this project to confirm additional funding. This has been signed by the project lead and is now with the council.	
5.2.2	Notwithstanding the above, FM advised that the project lead remained worried about inflationary pressures to the project and the potential need for more money or value engineering.	
5.2.3	Board agreed that given this project had already received substantially more investment from the Towns Fund than initially expected, the project leads should not assume any additional monies from the Fund were available. They said that other options for funding should be explored.	
5.2.4	The Chair asked RR to request the project lead's attendance at future PDG to discuss his concerns further.	RR
5.3	Encore Music Hub	
5.3.1	IA confirmed that RR had written to the project lead to confirm the additional money offered to the project for the purchase of St Nicholas Church was no longer available, given that option was no longer being pursued.	
5.3.2	IA advised that a search for suitable premises was still ongoing.	
5.4	Greening the City	
5.4.1	IA advised that following last month's Board, the project lead had been requested to provide an update. This had resulted in new visuals being received and circulated to Board members in advance of today's meeting. The Chair commented that she would still like to 'walk the route' of the proposed new path so she could fully understand the revised proposals.	
5.4.2	RS confirmed that she had held discussions with the project leads and Hereford Civic Society to address some concerns raised by the Society. Her understanding was that these concerns had been satisfactorily resolved and the project leads are now targeting completion of the path works by the end of 2025. PS commented that if RS is satisfied that the Civic Society's concerns have been addressed, he would support her judgement.	
5.4.3	PS raised concern about the lateness of the project lead's advice of these changes to Board. He requested more detail on the specifics of the new paths. RS will meet with PS after today's Board to brief him further. RS also to update Board on a specific point raised by BP regarding the proposed widening of the path near Sainsbury's supermarket.	RS/PS
5.4.4	FM raised a more general concern about how Board is kept to up to date with substantial changes to the original plans for all projects. BP agreed with this saying the most recent drawings submitted by this project's lead were very different from the original plans.	
5.4.5	RR were asked to produce an audit of all projects that outlines where substantial changes to original proposals had been made.	RR





5.5	Transforming Wyeside	
5.5.1	IA advised that following previous Board decision, a Deed of Variation has been issued to this project to confirm revised project details. This has been signed by the project lead and is now with the council.	
5.5.2	IA said that the project lead had advised progress is being made with the planning application for the crane. However, IA said there is still risk associated with the project as there is no indication of support for the crane installation from the Environment Agency. He suggested that the Board set a time limit on how long they will wait for a decision on planning to be made.	
5.5.3	Board members were concerned about the implications for the proposed footpath if planning is not granted. They referenced previous discussions about the proposed footpath now being designated the legal right of way but were still awaiting clarification on the legal position.	
5.5.4	RR to ask the project lead to attend at PDG as soon as possible to discuss the project critical path and also to understand what their plan is if planning is not granted.	RR
5.5.5	The Board discussed a broader point regarding the need to ensure as far as possible that all projects deliver their objectives before the end of the programme. Members wanted to understand the timings that have to be in place to achieve this and to ensure that any unallocated monies can be reallocated to other projects before the deadline.	
5.6	The Southside Project	
5.6.1	IA advised that contractors are about to be engaged by Belmont Wanderers. He suggested that the project lead is invited to PDG to provide an update and so that appropriate support with delivery of the construction project can be offered.	RR
5.7	Hereford Museum & Art Gallery and Shirehall (Library) Projects	
5.7.1	The Chair highlighted the importance of keeping in close contact with these projects. The next Stronger Hereford Board is to focus on a detailed update from both projects, prior to which they will be invited to attend PDG.	RR

	whether money can be invested in capital or revenue legacy projects. JNo said it would be useful to gain further clarification on this, though intuitively it would make sense to invest in a campaign to raise awareness of what individual projects and the overall programme had achieved, thanks to the fund.	
8.4	RR will draft a revised Legacy Programme plan for discussion at PDG in July and then be included on the Agenda for the August Board.
