LEOMINSTER INDUSTRIAL ESTATE ACCESS ROAD AND ITS EXTENSION TO FORM AN EAST-WEST LINK

Leominster District Council, Hereford and Worcester County Council, Leominster Town Council and the Rural Development Commission appointed Allott & Lomax Consulting Engineers to prepare a feasibility study into:

- i) achieving improved access to Leominster Industrial Estate, primarily to enable the release of additional employment land to its south; and
- ii) ensuring that any improved access is capable of extension to form an east-west link between the A49(T) Leominster By-pass and the A44 at Barons Cross in order to take through traffic out of residential areas and the town centre.

Research was undertaken, including field surveys and traffic modelling, and organisations with a primary interest in land use were consulted upon their requirements and constraints.

This work enabled a number of options to be identified and evaluated for routes both to the east and to the west of Hereford Road. Environmental considerations were also evaluated covering matters such as traffic noise, air quality, nature conservation and landscape effects. A brief explanation of the analysis is presented in this leaflet and through the exhibition.



options are presented for routes both to the east and to the west of Hereford Road:

EASTERN OPTIONS (Leominster By-pass to Hereford Road)

- Blue Route:

this uses a new bridge immediately to the south of the existing one.

- Red Route:

this involves replacing the Worcester Road roundabout further to the south with a new link to Eaton Hill and new bridge over the railway.

- Yellow/Green Route:

a further roundabout to the south would be provided together with a

new bridge over the railway.

WESTERN OPTIONS (Hereford Road to Barons Cross)

- Red Route:

sweeps widely to the south to meet the Monkland Road.

- Yellow Route:

passes closer to Leominster yet also meets the Monkland Road.

- Green Route:

similar to the yellow route but links with the new access serving

Safeway supermarket.


