Workshop 1: Hearing the voices of children with disabilities

- However, in order to achieve a gold standard for participation practitioners need to be afforded time to focus on the individual; focus on the little things and push those things forward to senior management in order to embed change!

Workshop 2: Support for Children with Disabilities and their families: How do we bridge the gaps?

The themes identified by the workshop included:

- Where should Herefordshire invest limited resources?
 - Bespoke targeted flexible family support
 - o Skills development for parents and service providers across the range of needs
 - o Services that work through transition points rather than before or after e.g. 0-25 or 16+
- What's already in the toolbox that could be better used?
 - Targeted family support what should it look like? Why do so few families receive it? Is it provided at the right times?
 - Local community support access to youth groups/ activities? Maximising facilities e.g. schools & special schools?
 - o Participation resources how to strengthen the voices of children with disabilities?
- What could workshop participants do to help bridge the gap?
 - o Consider re-registration to provide overnight short breaks
 - Provide age appropriate positive activities for disabled teenagers and young adults
 - Sharing information about support for families on the edge of care

Workshop 3: Personalisation, Direct Payments and Personal Budgets – the Children & Families Act 2014 and moving forward

- Family support service why do so few access it review what is family support / what should it look like Family support have more success
- Family support have more success

What could workshop participants do to help bridge the gap?

- 7-day holidays PGL
- Edge of care capacity think about what other providers could contribute to this
- Sharing info family support available/ capacity but don't know who they are (e.g. Hope Centre)
- Senad offer to develop site in Bromyard could provide care (not registered for respite care / issue of personal budget and will it pay for it
- 18-25yr olds MFN are looking to set up a group with ECHO making it more age appropriate (vs 50-70yr old group & 18yr old not wanting to join in

 not dictated by council more flexibly
- Provider
 - Can build demand
 - Directory of services
 - To grow business
 - Individual service fund
 - Learning from other providers / parents / councils
 - Flexibility of specific services

Weaknesses

- Service User
 - Lack of awareness
 - Parent controls budget not child
 - o Parents don't understand jargon
 - o Another thing for parents to do
 - May limit how much service can be bought
 - Group may include a young person who doesn't have a Direct Payment - excluded
- Provider
 - Lack of security
 - Output v income
 - Billing
 - Finance chasing payment
 - Ofsted / regulatory restrictions / CQC
 - Quality monitoring different monitoring tools for each provider
 - Unsure how Direct Payment would affect organisation / practicality
 - Too small to deliver / collaborate
 - Overhead costs managing finances
 - Lack of market rural area more expensive to deliver services

Threats

- Service User
 - Mismanagement of budget
 - Family not able to manage
 - Cuts to service
 - o Employment responsibility
- Provider
 - Risk to business
 - Expectation of families
 - No guarantee open market
 - No guarantee of workflow
 - Need for new marketing and business practices
 - Pricing setting / collecting
