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Appendix 1: Screening of full options matrix

1.0 Introduction

- 1.1 To ensure that the requirements of the Habitats Directive and Regulations are met it is necessary to consider the options considered through the HRA process to the Callow and Haywood NDP.
- 1.2 The purpose of this further HRA Addendum Report is to detail the findings of the screening of the full options considered during the development of the Callow and Haywood NDP and consider if they significantly affect the conclusions of the earlier first HRA Report (November 2014) and Addendum report (May 2015).
- 1.3 However, the review of the options are not considered to significantly affect the conclusions of the earlier HRA reports, as they do not materially change the overall aims and objectives of the policies, but show the background to the development of the policies.
- 1.4 Within the original HRA report, November 2014, paragraph 4.6 states 'There is no evidence that alternative options were considered prior to launching into the drafting of the plan and consequently it was impossible to undertake this element of the assessment.' However the Parish have confirmed that options were considered throughout the development of the plan and the options were informed from the production of the Community Led Plan in 2012/2013, therefore this Addendum replaces paragraph 4.6. The options covered the topics that were likely to formulate the policies going forward in the Plan.

2.0 Summary of main findings of the assessment of the options

2.1 Appendix 1 of this Addendum shows the summary matrix of the full options that have been assessed for the Callow and Haywood NDP. None of the options are found to have a significant effect upon the River Wye SAC. However criterion within policies should help towards mitigating against any potential effect that could come forward with development within the Parish.

3.0 Conclusion

3.1 With reference to section 2 above, the full options considered during the development of the NDP are not considered to affect the findings of the first HRA report and addendum.

3.2 Therefore the earlier conclusion that the Callow and Haywood NDP will not have a likely significant effect on the River Wye SAC remains valid.

4.0 Next steps

4.1 This Addendum Report will be published for a 5 week consultation with the Key Stakeholders and also on the Herefordshire Council website.
